Mayor Giles called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT-PERSONAL COMMUNICATION-CORRESPONDENCE:

Mayor Giles said the City received a notification from the USDA concerning the availability of funds for direct loans.

MINUTES REVIEW-APPROVAL:

Councilman Rowe moved to approve the May 15, 2018 regular City Council meeting minutes as submitted.

Mayor Giles reported that Rita Happy did not make the promised payments on her delinquent account which were a condition for reconnection of the service, and the sewer service has again been disconnected.

The Council recommended that the Public Works Department periodically check disconnected sewer services to insure they are not being tampered with.

CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARING / NUISANCE DETERMINATION / 1085 AMHERST AVE:

Staff reported the property has not been cleaned and there was no response from the owner.

A request was made to the Sheriff's Office for an inmate work crew to clean this property and five other properties, but no response has yet been received.

Councilman Murphy moved to find that the condition of the property at 1085 Amherst constitutes a menace to public safety, health and welfare and to authorize staff to proceed with having the property cleaned.

Motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING / NUISANCE DETERMINATION / 945 DARTMOUTH AVE.-435 9TH ST.:

Staff presented photographs of the property taken earlier in the day which indicate the property has been partially cleaned of the debris.

Councilman Rowe moved to authorize staff to speak with the property owner and explain what needs to be done to complete the cleanup of the property.
