5.010 General city election; No primary election.

1. There must be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November of each even-numbered year, commencing November 2006, a general city election for the purpose of electing officers of the city.
2. There shall be no primary city election held for the purpose of nominating candidates for officers of the city. (Ord. #232)

5.020 Election; Terms of office; Mayor; Councilmen.

1. Candidates for all city offices as may be provided by law are elected by electorate of the city at large.
2. All elected officers shall serve four-year staggered terms.
3. There shall be one (1) mayor and three (3) councilmen. From and after March 1, 1996 the councilmen positions shall be designated as Council Seat A, Council Seat B and Council Seat C. The former North Ward City councilman shall be the Council Seat A councilman, the former South Ward City councilman shall be the Council Seat B councilman and the former West Ward City councilman shall be the Council Seat C councilman.
 - a). The Council Seat B councilman and the Council Seat C councilman shall be elected at the November 2006 general election for a four-year term, with the holders of such offices in office of the effective date of Ordinance Number 232 holding office until the end of his/her term and until his/her successor has been elected and qualified.
 - b) The mayor and Council Seat A councilman shall be elected at the November 2008 general election for a four-year term, with the holders of such offices in office on the effective date of Ordinance Number 232 holding office until the end of his/her term and until his/her successor has been elected and qualified. 5.030 Candidates for Office; Filing, Filing fee.

1. All candidates for elective offices of the City must be nominated as provided in Nevada Revised Statutes Title 21 and Nevada Revised Statutes Title 24.
2. Each candidate for an elective office of the City shall pay a filing fee of forty

dollars (\$40.00)

5.040 Registration of Voters. Voters for all City elections must be registered in accordance with the laws of the State of Nevada. (Ord. No. 228)

5.050 Voting Places: Designation. All voters shall vote at the Lovelock City Hall at 400 14th Street, Lovelock, Nevada, unless another voting place is designated by the City Clerk. (Ord. No. 204)

5.060 State law to govern elections.
All City elections and all election procedures used in City elections must be in accordance with the laws of the State of Nevada, except as otherwise provided by this chapter. (Ord. No. 228)

5.070 Penalties. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as provided in section 35.010. (Sec. 7, Ord. No. 122)
