25.010 Findings of city council.

The city council finds pursuant to NRS 266.155, 266.366 and 278.583 that:

1. The city council may regulate all matters relating to the construction, maintenance and safety of buildings, structures and property within the city;
2. The city council may adopt a uniform electrical code printed in book or pamphlet form, with such modifications as do not reduce the standards in such uniform electrical code, by reference thereto; and
3. After January 1, 1974, any construction, alteration or change in the use of a building or other structure in the city by any person, whether public or private, is to be in compliance with the technical provisions of the latest edition of the National Electrical Code as adopted by the National Fire Protection Association. 25.020 Adoption of 1975 edition of National Electrical Code.

The 1975 edition of the National Electrical Code adopted by the National Fire Protection Association, a copy of which is placed on file in the office of the city clerk, together with such modifications contained in this chapter and resolutions adopted by the city council from time to time as are reasonably necessary in the city, is hereby adopted by reference, incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and shall regulate all matters contained therein. 25.030 Enforcing authority.

Enforcement of this chapter and the National Electrical Code (1975 edition) is the responsibility of the building official designated as provided in section 23.030. (Sec. 3, Ord. No. 137)

25.040 Fees.

Payment to the city of building permit fees specified in section 23.050 shall constitute payment of any fees required by this chapter. (Sec. 4, Ord. No. 137)

25.050 Violations and penalties.

1. It is unlawful for any person to violate any of the provisions of this chapter or the National Electrical Code (1975 edition). Any person violating the provisions of this chapter or the National Electrical Code (1975 edition) is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment in the city jail for not more than 6 months, or by both such fines and imprisonment.
2. Each such person is guilty of a separate offense for each day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or the National Electrical Code (1975 edition) is committed, continued or permitted. (Sec. 5, Ord. No. 137)
