PUBLIC COMMENT-PERSONAL COMMUNICATION-CORRESPONDENCE:

Lt. Governor Anthony gave an overview of Lieutenant Governor office functions, including sponsor of SP24 small businesses and developing Nevada tourism. The Lt. Governor serves as vice chair of the transportation board.

Neil Gallagher thanked the City for all the help with supplying dumpsters and dump trailers for the community cleanup day. The group is discussing the planting of trees around the City.

Mayor Giles reported that service at 1505 Franklin Avenue was turned off because no payment was made, and a lien for \$736.40 was placed on the property. Council member McKinney said payment in full must be made before the service is turned on.

City Clerk Wilcox explained that she spoke with the title company about the Cadillac Inn being sold for cash and explained the city has a lien on the property.

An account write-off list was reviewed. Council member McKinney moved to approve the write off list as presented.

RENEWAL PROPOSAL FROM NEVADA PUBLIC AGENCY INSURANCE POOL (POOL) / PROVIDE 2024-2025 CITY PROPERTY / LIABILITY / CYBER RISK ENVIRONMENTAL LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE:

Jarrod Hickman and Kent Mowry gave an overview of the programs. Hickman stated that there will be a 12% increase in the liability insurance premium for the City.

Council member Reynolds moved to approve the proposal for the property, liability, cyber risk and environmental liability insurance coverage through the Nevada Public Agency Insurance Pool for a sum not to exceed \$95,000.

Chief Mancebo reported that one officer will attend POST in July, and effective July 1 the ARC physicals are increasing in cost by \$100.

Council member Reynolds reported attending the RTC meeting and that he will be gone June 18. There are 33 graduating high school students.

Council member McKinney reported there is a Recreation Board meeting on Thursday. She will not be here for the July 16 meeting. The Glen Wasson basketball tournament is this weekend.

Mayor Giles reported: (i) advertising for a half time person for the office will start; (ii) Maverik is starting work on the fuel station-convenience store; (iii) sewer plant improvements are back on track; (iv) Uprise Fiber needs to obtain right of ways from the department of transportation; (v) there is a League of Cities executive board meeting on Friday; (vi) letters were sent to each county commissioner that the city is not in favor of having the General Dollar Store at the Windmill location; and, (vii) Clerk Wilcox went to the CDBG meeting in Carson City, and the city can now put in for grants for the 2025 season.
